

Face and Body Paints are made of US & EU compliant ingredients that are free of perfume, paraben, lanolin, beeswax or gluten. The paints are made without any animal based products and not tested on animals. The water based formula are specifically designed to be hypo-allergenic and safe to be used on sensitive skin.

How To Remove Face Paint

Water-based face paint washes off with mild soap and water. Using water alone presses the face paint into the skin which makes it a little harder to remove completely.

Do not scrub! Lather up with a gentle soap, and massage it into your face with your hands. If there is any staining left behind from face paint, the best ways to remove it is using micellar water, makeup remover or any Natural Oil. Face painting stains will completely fade with no additional effort after a shower or bath. It's best to wash off face paint before bed. Face paint can stain bedding and cause skin irritation.

How To Remove Glitter

Dab the area with Scotch Tape to remove most of the glitter *optional.

Use Baby Oil, Coconut Oil or other Natural Oils like Olive Oil.

Dip your fingers in the oil and using circular motions, lightly rub it over the glittered areas. Gently apply face wash using a cotton pad or wipe or just water-soaked cotton wipe. Discard the wipe after one use as it can collect glitter. Continue using fresh wipes until all the glitter comes off. Wash your hands in warm, soapy water. This can remove any remaining oil and glitter.

AVOID:

Using makeup remover /which makes the glitter adhere to the skin.
Using face wipes alone /they only spread glitter around your skin.
Rubbing the skin /that just moves the glitter around the face.
